Welcome to this special Sung Evensong on the first Sunday of Trinity, which marks the 60th anniversary of the Queen's Coronation. This service also represents our church's first foray into the programme of the West End Festival, and we are delighted to be joined by the Jordanhill Liturgical Choir. Directed by Alan Tavener, this ecumenical choir was formed in 2011 and draws its members from All Saints, Jordanhill Parish Church of Scotland, Our Lady of Perpetual Succour Roman Catholic Church, and other neighbouring churches. Our organist is Leslie Macleod. There will be a retiring collection in aid of the Storehouse foodbank.

It is our practise to stand for hymns and psalms, the Magnificat, the Nunc Dimittis and the Creed; to sit during the Lessons; and to kneel for prayer. However, please adopt whatever posture is suitable for you.

THE ORDER FOR EVENING PRAYER

Opening Voluntary: J.S. Bach: Fantasia in G minor.

Introit: Thomas Tallis: If ye love me.

*Hymn number 334: All people that on earth do dwell
(setting by Vaughan Williams of The Old 100th, first
performed at the Queen's Coronation).*

*The Introduction having been said, the Minister and the
whole Congregation after him shall say this general
Confession, all kneeling:*

ALMIGHTY and most merciful Father, We have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep, We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, We have offended against thy holy laws, We have left undone those things which we ought to have done, And we have done those things which we ought not to have done, And there is no health in us: But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us miserable offenders; Spare thou them, O God, which confess their faults, Restore thou them that are penitent, According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesu our Lord: And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. *Amen.*

*The Absolution, or Remission of sins, to be pronounced
by the Priest alone, standing: the people still kneeling.*

ALMIGHTY God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desireth not the death of a sinner, but rather that he may turn from his wickedness and live; and hath given power and commandment to his Ministers, to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the Absolution and Remission of their sins: He pardoneth and absolveth all them that truly repent and unfeignedly believe his holy Gospel. Wherefore let us beseech him to grant us true repentance and his Holy Spirit, that those things may please him which we do at this present, and that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy; so that at the last we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Then likewise the Minister shall say,

O LORD, open thou our lips;

Answer. And our mouth shall shew forth thy praise.

Minister. O God, make speed to save us;

Answer. O Lord, make haste to help us.

Here, all standing up, the Minister shall say,

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son : and to the Holy Ghost;

Answer. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be : world without end. Amen.

Minister. Praise ye the Lord;

Answer. The Lord's Name be praised.

Then shall be sung Psalms 1 and 121.

Then a Lesson of the Old Testament, from the Book of Joshua, chapter 2.

And after that Magnificat, or the Song of the Blessed Virgin Mary, as followeth (setting in A Major by Herbert Sumsion).

MAGNIFICAT

St. Luke 1. 46.

MY soul doth magnify the Lord : and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour.

2 For he hath regarded : the lowliness of his hand-maiden.

3 For behold, from henceforth : all generations shall call me blessed.

4 For he that is mighty hath magnified me : and holy is his Name.

5 And his mercy is on them that fear him throughout all generations.

6 He hath shewed strength with his arm : he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts.

7 He hath put down the mighty from their seat : and hath exalted the humble and meek.

8 He hath filled the hungry with good things : and the rich he hath sent empty away.

9 He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel : as he promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed for ever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost;

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be : world without end. Amen.

Then a Lesson of the New Testament, from the Book of Acts, reading from chapter 3 and verse 1 to chapter 4 and verse 4.

And after that Nunc dimittis, or the Song of Simeon, as followeth (setting in A Major by Herbert Sumsion).

NUNC DIMITTIS

St. Luke 2. 29.

O LORD, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace : according to thy word.

2 For mine eyes have seen : thy salvation;

3 Which thou hast prepared : before the face of all people;

4 To be a light to lighten the Gentiles : and to be the glory of thy people Israel.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son : and to the Holy Ghost;

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be : world without end. Amen.

Then shall be said the Apostles' Creed, by the Minister and the people standing.

I BELIEVE in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth:

And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord, Who was conceived by the holy Ghost, Born of the Virgin Mary, Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, dead, and buried: He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Ghost; The holy Catholic Church; The Communion of Saints; The Forgiveness of sins; The Resurrection of the body, And the Life everlasting. Amen.

And after that these prayers following, all kneeling: the Minister first pronouncing with a loud voice,

The Lord be with you;

Answer. And with thy spirit.

Minister. Let us pray.

Lord, have mercy upon us.

Christ, have mercy upon us.

Lord, have mercy upon us.

Then the Minister, Clerks, and people shall say the Lord's Prayer with a loud voice.

OUR Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.

Then the Minister standing up shall say,

O Lord, shew thy mercy upon us;

Answer: And grant us thy salvation.

Minister: O Lord, save the Queen;

Answer: And mercifully hear us when we call upon thee.

Minister: Endue thy Ministers with righteousness;

Answer: And make thy chosen people joyful.

Minister: O Lord, save thy people;

Answer: And bless thine inheritance.

Minister: Give peace in our time, O Lord;

Answer: Because there is none other that fighteth for us, but only thou, O God.

Minister: O God, make clean our hearts within us;

Answer: And take not thy Holy Spirit from us.

Minister: Let us pray.

Then shall follow three Collects: The first of the Day: The second for Peace: The third for Aid against all Perils, as hereafter followeth. the people devoutly kneeling: which last two Collects shall be said daily at Evening Prayer without alteration.

The Second Collect at Evening Prayer.

O GOD, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works do proceed: Give unto thy servants that peace which the world cannot give; that both our hearts may be set to obey thy commandments, and also that by thee we being defended from the fear of our enemies may pass our time in rest and quietness; through the merits of Jesus Christ our Saviour. *Amen.*

The Third Collect, for aid against all perils.

LIGHTEN our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord; and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

Retiring collection for the Storehouse food bank.

The Storehouse food bank

All Saints, Jordanhill, has partnered with a Vineyard church to support a food bank serving north west Glasgow.

The Storehouse is located less than a mile from All Saints in Linden Street, Anniesland.

It's open every Saturday morning to give packages of food and toiletries to around 35 recipients referred by churches, charities and statutory agencies. Many have had their benefits cut - sometimes only temporarily, but the family still needs to be fed. Some are asylum seekers with no income whatsoever. Others simply can't cope.

The service is an outreach by Glasgow Westend Vineyard, which meets in Notre Dame secondary school. They established Storehouse in 2011 as part of their social ministry.

Peter Fowler, the compassion pastor at Vineyard, told The Herald last December: "When we first started, we weren't entirely sure how great the need was.

"When we did open, we really realised there was a huge need that was hidden beneath the surface.

"The aim is not to make people dependent on us, but to help them to break the cycle of poverty, which has lots of different causes."

Peter met the All Saints Vestry in February, impressing its members greatly with his explanations of the ministry's biblical foundation and practical approach, and has since paid two more visits to the congregation.

Both Vestry and congregation have welcomed the opportunity to engage ecumenically in a local social action outreach, and we are making weekly contributions of food and toiletries.



Please consider picking up some of these items as you do your usual shop ...

- Food: tinned fish, meat, fruit and veg; pasta, rice and cooking sauce; tea, coffee, long-life milk, small bags of sugar; juice; small packs of cereal.
- Toiletries: washing powder, tablets and liquid; washing up liquid; shampoo; soap, shower gel; toothbrushes and paste; toilet roll; size 4 or 4+ nappies.
